Dear local residents, business owners and all other interested parties,

We are sending you this letter to inform you of the developments regarding the City Centre Campus.

University Library BG premises zoning plan and integrated environmental permit irrevocable

For the realisation of the new University Library on the Binnengasthuis premises (BG premises), an integrated environmental permit and an amendment to the zoning plan 'First Revision of Postcode Area 1012 zoning plan' were requested in February 2014. The Amsterdam municipal council adopted the zoning plan and the corresponding integrated environmental permit in the summer of 2015. An appeal against this decision was filed with the Council of State (RvS). The RvS rejected this appeal and, as a result, the zoning plan and the corresponding integrated environmental permit have become irrevocable. The path is now clear for the UvA to construct the University Library on the BG premises. The Council of State published its ruling on 16 March 2016.

Construction on hold while scenarios are elaborated

The UvA is currently elaborating two scenarios for the design of the City Centre Campus. In time, both scenarios will be presented to the academic community. Until this time, despite the Council of State's ruling in favour of the UvA, construction of the University Library on the City Centre Campus will not begin.

Relocation of part of the Humanities to the Bushuis and the Oost Indisch Huis

At the end of May 2016, a section of the Humanities staff will move from the Bungehuis to the Bushuis on the Kloveniersburgwal and the Oost-Indisch Huis on the Oude Hoogstraat.

The Bungehuis is one of the UvA buildings to be sold as a result of the clustering of academic disciplines at four open city campuses. As their definitive location on the City Centre Campus is not yet ready to accommodate them, these employees will be based in the Bushuis and (a part of) the Oost-Indisch Huis for the next five to ten years.
